Dr. Joe Hocking Addressed These Items of Interest:

CAB has one of the safest school environments. Families should not have any extra concerns.

Parking and dropping off students in the morning should NOT be in apartment complex behind CAB as the residents have complained. There is a possibility for next school year with a collaboration with CSW for a shuttle bus service from the parking lot down the street where the farmer's market is.

7 a.m. to enter the building is a school district mandate. Without supervision in the school, it is considered not safe for anyone. If a joint effort can be worked out with CSW for an adult to be in lobby, then perhaps students could come in earlier. These are all ideas, not carved in stone nor should they be expectations.
